#### Maternal, Neonatal and Child Health Intervention Program



Almost 95% of deaths in pregnant women occur in low and lower-middle-income countries. with Nigeria leading the negative indices in Africa - over 800 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births with a neonatal mortality rate of 33 per 1000 live births. The situation must be addressed and the Coalition, supported by the TGI Group, will be unveiling the MNCH Intervention Programme in the coming weeks to achieve a number of key objectives all of which are geared to impact positively on this particular disease burden.
